27th Research Training Program (RTP) 2025 – IUSAM-APdeBA



IUSAM-APdeBA had the pleasure of hosting the 27th edition of the Research Training Program (RTP) for four full days from Monday, September 15 to Thursday, September 18, 2025. The main objective of this program, organized by the International Psychoanalytical Association (IPA), is to support candidates and members of the organization, as well as researchers not affiliated with the IPA, in the conceptualization and implementation of studies in the broad field of contemporary psychoanalytic research. The activity focuses on discussing the participants' research in consultations with an international faculty of visiting professors with extensive experience in psychoanalytic research.

The 27th edition of the RTP featured an international faculty that included Dr. Stephan Hau (Sweden), Dr. Rogerio Lerner (Brazil), Dr. Andrea Rodríguez Quiroga (Argentina), Dr. Clara Schejtman (Argentina), Dr. Erik Stanicke (Norway), and Dr. Line Stanicke (Norway). In addition, Dr. Santiago Juan was the local host for IUSAM-APdeBA, and Ana Paiva was present as the IPA executive officer in charge of research grants. The group of participants consisted of 21 researchers from Argentina, Brazil, Mexico, Norway, Peru, the Czech Republic, and Uruguay. 18 ongoing projects were presented, both in plenary sessions and in small group discussions. The projects covered a variety of topics, including community approaches with vulnerable populations, systematic case studies, instrument adaptations, computer tools for discourse analysis, learning processes, and clinical competencies, among others. Each professor also shared their research background and current interests with the group. A presentation was also given on the process of applying for IPA research grants. We enjoyed a welcome lunch at IUSAM-APdeBA, attended by the rector of IUSAM, Dr. Inés Vidal, and the president of

APdeBA, Dr. Sergio Rojtenberg. We also enjoyed a final toast on Thursday, the 18th. The discussion of each project generated valuable feedback for each process and, fundamentally, the activity left us with a fruitful exchange and open networks of interaction.
